The Power of Writing/Journaling

William Shakespeare, Thomas Edison, Ernest Hemingway, Sylvia Plath, Anne Frank, C. S. Lewis, who were they? What did they have in common?

When C. S. Lewis, mourning his wife's death, tried to talk to his children about her, he lamented, "They look as if I were committing an indecency." So he poured his grief out in a journal. Thomas Edison reminded us, "Never go to sleep without a request to your subconscious".

How do we cleanse our minds, sort out the bad from the good when everything is so jumbled up it confuses us, drags us down, puts us in depression and keeps the black cloud hanging over us constantly? Science has proven journaling is a tool bringing our jumbled up thoughts to light, clearing our minds to help form our ideas.

Keeping a daily journal is healing. It helps to unbury our feelings, It's beneficial citing gains in insight and self-understanding. Putting our thoughts and feelings into a journal helps us confront them, organize them and wrest the meaning from them. It leads us not only through our darkness, but also through our happiness, as well. It opens up our minds to explore our thoughts and feelings. Writing allows us to organize those many thoughts swirling about our minds in craziness, bringing us to a soothing calmness. Journaling protects us from outside judgments. It is there for our eyes and minds alone, unless we choose to share. We gain empowerment with journaling, bringing us stability in our lives, reducing our stress, while keeping us in the present moment.

OA gives us the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions and the nine tools of recovery: A Plan of Eating, Sponsorship, Meetings, Telephone, Writing (Journaling), Literature, Action Plan, Anonymity and Service. OA also speaks of the 3-legged stool - Emotional, Spiritual & Physical.

Writing & Journaling is a very important tool which helps us to bring this balance into our lives. If you have incorporated writing into you daily life - Bravo to you!! If not - won't you please start to implement this very important tool into your daily life? The benefits of this mighty tool of writing/journaling await you. - M. W.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 7/8/2019 INTERGROUP MEETING & REPORTS

- Susan T. was elected 2020 convention chair.

- Treasurer offered notes that the finances are at about even with last year at this time. She asked to please thank your groups for their generosity. By June they contributed \$5,464.71.

- A committee was convened to discuss our Office, its efficacy and viability. J-MO discusses how we deal with 'hot' issues and the courtesy and conscience that governs OA. Groups will be informed of results and/or information in 3 ways: 1) Representatives are given reports and information which they relay to groups, 2) newsletters, and 3) email and/or special reports that are sent out to IG with a request to report. - The number of users for our website users in July was 272.

- Literature sales for May were \$271.95, June - \$77.65, July - \$465.25, with an additional \$2.70 donation.

- Public Information - Some ideas to explore (as group conscious dictates) include having: communication and contact lists, Podcast possibilities, and Facebook closed meetings. A couple of volunteers are ready to work with youth. September will likely be the roll out date for a full discussion and exploration of those plans.
