## BEING AT PEACE WITH MY "PIECE" IN THE WORLD

*This was written at the St. Louis OA Bi-State convention held last month in St. Louis.*

During the "Writing as a Tool" session on Saturday, one of the speakers shared a thought that spoke to me about just being the puzzle piece she was made to be and not worrying about being too much or too little. I was thinking about that on Sunday morning and wrote in my journal:

"I have a place here. My puzzle piece fits and I have something to give that only I can offer. Me. Grateful for that."

During the "Staying in the Sunlight" session, one of the speakers encouraged us to find a small group of people that we can belong to in OA. As she said that, I visualized my one puzzle piece surrounded by my people from my home group and I realized that I fit perfectly right there. I also realized that for the past year I've been a part of OA, I've known I belong here. But I have been looking for a place along the edges that I could just quietly sneak into. On Sunday, it hit me - I'm not an edge piece.

I don't have to be right in the middle of the picture. I don't even know where the middle is because I can't see the whole picture. But I do know I'm a puzzle piece that needs to be surrounded by other puzzle pieces that fit me, who can give me the love and acceptance that I need.

I have found that in this program and "grateful" is not a big enough word to describe all that my heart is feeling today. -E.G.

I met Margie at an OA retreat in 1984. We just started talking and soon discovered we had a lot in common. However, at first glance, our lives were very different. She was a former dance instructor recently diagnosed with multiple sclerosis (MS) and battling weight gain. I was a hair stylist with my own shop in South St. Louis City.

We were both new to OA and, when told to get a sponsor, asked one another. We talked about food. More importantly, we talked about our feelings that could lead us to eat. We made plans for the next convention, read OA literature and shared, and worked the steps together. We talked almost every day. We met in person every four to six weeks when Margie traveled from north St. Louis County to my beauty shop for her hair appointment.

As Margie’s MS progressed, she required more care and eventually moved to a nursing home. There she worked with preschoolers and began embroidering items as gifts. Wherever she was, whatever the circumstances, she was happy.

I last saw her in spring 2016 when her nursing home took her to an outing in Kimmswick. I met her there for lunch.

Margie passed away on April 1, 2017. Mysteriously, I received a letter from her postmarked September 29, 2017. Somehow, it was forwarded to my new home address after her passing. In it, she thanked me for my friendship and love. Ours was a great fellowship – and a special relationship. I miss her and thank her for the tremendous gifts she shared with me.
