St. Louis Bi-State Intergroup Minutes

March 12, 2023 1:30 p.m.

Open: The meeting was called to order by Chair, Dianne S. at 1:30 p.m. Zoom recording feature enabled for the duration of the meeting. All members were informed of the recording process.

Communications: Meeting was held via ZOOM. Members were instructed on meeting ID and Password via email. Representatives were notified via email the agenda, previous meeting minutes, and committee/service reports.

Readings: Serenity Prayer, The Twelve Steps, Tradition 3, Concept 3

Welcome: 20 members in total were in attendance; all via ZOOM. Four BOT members, two committee chairs, one R4/WSO service member, 11 IG representatives, and two visitors. 19 eligible voters and a quorum was confirmed.

Minutes: February 12, 2023 minutes were distributed via email for review prior to the meeting. A correction to be made to the attendance regarding the breakdown of representatives and service members, the total voting number and quorum convened did not change. Minutes were approved once the correction was complete.

Reports: Chairperson and committee reports were distributed via email for review prior to the meeting. The following comments are in addition to the distributed reports:

• Vice-Chair, Elizabeth C updated the representatives on the progress of the Google ad supported by IG funding as having met the allotted visits to the St. Louis Bi-State Area website. It was planned to run through the end of March (first quarter of 2023). The campaign will be stopped tonight to not exceed the agreed upon amount of expenditure from IG. The Google ad campaign is viewed as successful in spreading the word about recovery in OA.

Seventh Tradition and Roll Call: Participants were documented and signed in by vice-chair. Representatives were encouraged to be responsible to contribute for Seventh Tradition. Due to updates with the website, members were informed the seventh tradition on-line feature is currently not functional. Web consultant is working to resolve this issue as soon as possible. The mailing address was confirmed to be P.O. Box 28882, St. Louis, Missouri 63123-0082 and shared with all members via the chat feature.

Intergroup Reps Home Meeting Comments:

 Amy G reported the Thursday, 10:00 am, Ferguson meeting is moving to a hybrid format in the second quarter of 2023. The meeting will host in-person and telephone attendees. More information to come in the future.

New Business:

 New In-Person OA meeting starting in Wentzville, MO. First meeting date is Friday, March 17, 2023 at 7 p.m. A recently relocated OA member has reached out to IG for

- support in start-up. Location is St. Patrick's Church, 405 S. Church Street, Wentzville in the Parish Center. Contact Elizabeth C at 215-932-0951
- P.A.C.E. (Program for All-Inclusive Care of the Elderly) Contacted our Intergroup to request bringing an OA meeting into their facility at the request of residents. Dianne S. and Christina D. will assist in starting a meeting to begin on Wednesday, March 22 at 1:00 p.m. Contact Dianne S for more information.

• Region 4 Presentation

- Trustee, Meg M The purpose of visiting our IG meeting is to share information about the stability of Region 4 and the health of other Intergroups within the region.
 - Changes in service volunteers within IG? Dianne offered that depending on the service requested, some areas are lacking. There are two inperson recovery events scheduled for 2023. It was noted the difficulty in maintaining representation from all registered area meetings. Also having difficulty getting groups to sponsor Super Saturday events. This intergroup is lacking full representation at World and Region. Meg commented that across the Region, World Service Organization (WSO), and recovery programs as a whole there has been a decrease in members and service volunteers; commenting the pandemic created many changes that have not yet recovered. She complimented our IG for having a great effort to get in-person events restarted. She encouraged persons giving service to rotate service in order to preserve willingness of more service in other areas of need. She assured members the World Service Business Conference (WSBC) will be addressing the decline in membership and service.
 - Zoom Bombing named Deep Fake. Meg explained how this may appear as familiar members asking to become the host of a meeting when in fact, they are fake members overtaking a real member's identity. WSO is working how to mitigate this particular problem. WSO has IT experts working on a publication that will be available to the entire membership.

Chair, Annette R

- Available Resources
 - Community Conversations opportunity happening each month through Region 4 available to all members to discuss issues within specific areas. Beginning next month, a topic of interest will be presented. April will focus on Public Information and Professional Outreach (PIPO). May will focus on Newcomers and June will highlight Twelfth Step Within.

• **Events** across the region will be highlighted in R4ward that appears twice a month. It also includes general information about the region and world admin@region4.org

Funding assistance

- Sending representatives to Region 4 Assembly
- PIPO-Meg suggested IG can write a proposal to R4 for funding the Google Ad campaign (up to \$300 can be made available). R4 would consider the proposal and vote at the next assembly if IG feels their financial support is desired
- New meeting start-up for literature
- R4 Assembly visitors are always welcome at Assembly. Spring Assembly will be held in-person in Des Moines, IA and the Fall Assembly will be virtual.
 - Region Chair and Vice-Chair will be open positions in October 2023

• Potential Service Positions within Intergroup

- Twelfth Step Within deals with retention of OA membership. (Recognition of World OA celebration on December 12, 2023)
- Public Information and Professional Outreach (PIPO) Dianne has information from the member who previously worked within this area of service, detailing what has been done. Recently we submitted a public service announcement (PSA) about OA being present in St. Louis area for 50 years. Also, J-MO has literature to present to medical professionals or persons working with the public. Literature can be obtained by contacting J-MO.
- Archivist seeking a member willing to keep treasured possessions that are currently in our storage locker.

• Storage Locker

Dianne discussed the possibility of emptying the locker of unused, unnecessary office supplies, outdated literature, and donated literature from closed meetings

Outdated literature and "used" literature will be available at the 50th Celebration Event for members/groups in need for a "love offering" or even, simply donated to a member/group in effort to decrease the amount of literature in storage. The goal is to deplete all literature IG is holding and members/groups will purchase directly from WSO. It was clarified that new editions of literature make previous editions obsolete and cannot be sold as OA literature. Previous editions can be donated to libraries or prisons or event new groups to get started.

Dianne opened the discussion to possibly be able to stop renting the storage locker if an "archivist" will volunteer to keep treasured possessions and another person to keep the required bookkeeping records (possibly a couple banker's boxes). Dianne shared the

contents of the locker with the group. Dianne asked for any objections to continuing to empty the locker.

- Questions from the Body:
 - What is the fee for keeping the facility? Answer: \$204 every two-months
 - Can IG hold a "garage sale" for the office supply contents? Answer:
 Difficulty would be the facility is gated and difficult to offer to the public.
 Dianne suggested representatives to refer group members to the final page of the Policy/Procedure manual for the full contents of the locker.
 - Possibly form a committee to determine the best way to dispose/donate/sell the contents? Ruth H will form a committee to oversee this project. Dianne will reach out to Ruth to assist.

Workgroups:

- **50**th **Celebration Event:** Latest update on registration revealed a count of 77 persons with daily calls from members inquiring if the event will accept walk-ins. Everyone is welcome to attend, but know the meals have been ordered and cannot be changed. However, anyone can bring food in yet still attend the full day of events. We Care Funds are still available for registration fees. Marina, IG Treasurer, will be at the registration table to serve persons paying the day of the event as well as persons requesting We Care Fund in anonymity. Service positions have been filled. Huggers and Greeters will be available as service throughout the event.
- **Fall Retreat:** Jeremy gave update on program outline. Specified local persons will be leading the sessions on Spirituality. Leaders will create their own presentation of the topic and the committee will support the presenter with supplies to carry-through. The committee will set boundaries for presenters so attendees will be protected from individual ideations on spirituality/religion, making the space safe for everyone regardless of definition of Higher Power.
 - Dianne S. discussed her experience at the Virtual Region Convention regarding spirituality through creativity. She volunteered to lead one of the sessions in this practice.
 - Members in attendance were asked to forward suggestions for leaders to Jeremy.

Dianne expressed gratitude to J-MO and Debbie K for help in orchestrating the Unity Day virtual event. Dianne reported over 30 attendees across US and Canada.

A. Upcoming Events.

B. About making flyers.

There is one change this year. Our long-standing guidelines for Super Saturdays require the words "Overeaters Anonymous" to be spelled out. We are now taking note that the arch logo as it stands today does not meet this requirement. Therefore, the logo is now optional.

Here are the flyer requirements, found in our Super Saturday Guidelines, which are posted on our website stlouisoa.org.

Include the following information:

- "Overeaters Anonymous" must be spelled out
- Hosting group
- Theme of the event
- Complete date; month, day, year
- Time, beginning and ending hours
- Address, a map or directions
- First name and phone # of a contact person
- Suggested donation amount, and a reminder never to stay away from an OA event for financial reasons
- Include notes regarding accessibility & parking [Accessibility is ease of use for people with disabilities, for instance people using a wheelchair. Stairs would be a problem.] But please don't say "handicap accessible." Just say "accessible."

Please, anyone who is making an event flyer, please consult with the vice-chair for suggestions before you make the final version, not just for approval afterwards.

C. Meeting Changes. One meeting has gone hybrid, and there is a new meeting.

The Thursday 10 am phone meeting in Ferguson, 21534, is adding a face-to-face component. It will be held at St Peter's Church, 1425 Stein Rd, Ferguson MO 63135. The phone component will continue, so this will be a Hybrid meeting.

GOOGLE SEARCH ADS REPORT, MAY 2023 – Covers data from January to April.

Here's how our 2023 Spring Campaign went.

The plan:

Get OA's name out there in the early spring when people are likely to be looking for weight-loss and other relevant programs. Cover January and February, and as far into March as the funding will reach. Hope for 2,000 extra people to see our intergroup website stlouisoa.org.

The funding:

\$3,000 (\$1,000 budgeted and \$2,000 special allocation).

How it works:

The OA name and our intergroup information appears sometimes when people in our intergroup area do Google searches for subjects like "weight loss programs," "binge eating disorder" or "overeaters anonymous." When people click on our name, they come to our website stlouisoa.org.

The results:

In January 2023 our Google Search Ads provided 1,090 extra visitors to our website.

In February 2023 our Google Search Ads provided **978 extra visitors to our website**.

So we have met our 2,000-visitor goal.

The campaign ran from January 1 through March 12, 2023. The total cost was \$2,775.09.

So we have met our goal of spending \$3,000 or less.
