St. Louis Bi-State Intergroup Minutes

June 11, 2023 1:30 p.m.

Open: The meeting was called to order by Chair, Dianne S. at 1:30 p.m. Zoom recording feature enabled for the duration of the meeting. All members were informed of the recording process.

Communications: Meeting was held via ZOOM. Members were instructed on meeting ID and Password via email. Representatives were notified via email the agenda, previous meeting minutes, and committee/service reports.

Readings: Serenity Prayer, The Twelve Steps, Tradition 6, Concept 6

Welcome: 13 members in total were in attendance; all via ZOOM. Four BOT members, one committee chair, one R4 representative, seven IG representatives, and no visitors. 13 eligible voters and a quorum was confirmed.

Minutes: May 7, 2023 minutes were distributed via email for review prior to the meeting. No corrections noted. Minutes were approved. Elizabeth C. offered to comment on the issue with the website 7th Tradition function mentioned in the May minutes has been restored to proper working order. Representatives were encouraged to inform their group members.

Reports: Chairperson and committee reports were distributed via email for review prior to the meeting. There were no questions regarding reports. However, general announcements regarding report(s) content were noted as follows:

- The financial reports contained some unusual "totals" due to a necessary change in software moving from desktop version to an online version as necessary through our bookkeeper. Dianne reported the numbers for line items are correct, however, totals on the Profit and Loss Statement do not add up correctly. This error impacts the Profit and Loss Previous Year Comparison report as well. Also impacted with this software change is the Group Contribution report, our bookkeeper noted the values reported are correct, however the software was not allowing to view the year-to-date totals for each group. The bookkeeper will continue to work with QuickBooks on-line help to resolve the issues. Treasurer report for June reflects good financial standing at this time.
- Elizabeth C. brought attention to meeting changes that occurred after the latest printing of the

Old Business:

- **Storage Locker:** Dianne S. reported there has been no further progress. More will be discussed in upcoming meetings
- **Region 4 Outreach Committee:** No further progress has been made. Please note the information regarding Region 4 in New Business.

New Business:

- Region 4: Dianne (IG Chair), Cyndy L (WSO delegate), and Marilyn F attended Region 4's special announce meeting last Sunday. Our Region 4 service board and trustee told us that they had made the difficult decision to disband Region 4. This will be a year-long process culminating with a summer event in 2024. Over the last four years, the Region has struggled to fill service board and committee chair positions, not all of the Regions intergroups send representatives to assemblies, participants to community conversations, or delegates to WSBC, despite scholarship opportunities. In general, there has been a decrease of the number of groups in the Region intergroups, the number of members in many groups, and even some of the Region intergroups have disbanded. Region 4 is already the smallest Region, and this ongoing loss of willing service volunteers dictates change is needed.
 - Our Intergroup will begin discussing our options in the near future. Meg M, our trustee, will keep us in the loop as the change progresses and we have more information so we can make an informed decision.
- **Board of Trustees Service Opportunities**: Two Board positions will be opening for the 2024 year. Intergroup Chair and Secretary will need to be filled and nominees voted on at the November 2023 annual business conference. Dianne S and Susan T are willing to train and mentor individuals giving service in these positions.

- Intergroup Secretary Responsibilities: Susan T gave an overview of duties and responsibilities in this position as she has served in for the past four (4) years.
 Please refer to the Policy/Procedure manual for a comprehensive list
- Qualifications: 6 months current abstinence and continuous abstinence throughout the elected term
- Skill and Hardware Requirements:
 - Computer access is essential
 - o Software needs: Microsoft Word or equivalent, Dropbox
 - Working knowledge of email communications
 - Working knowledge of Word for report generation
 - Working knowledge of iCloud storage
 - Organizational skills to track outstanding email responses and in preparing for each IG meeting

o Time Requirements:

- IG meeting months (8 regular meetings) takes approximately 5 hours per month to transcribe minutes, collect committee reports, distribute information to representatives
- Preparing for Conference is more intensive, likely being 10 hours that month, attending BOT review process then preparing motions for consideration
- After conference, updating procedures and bylaws takes a few hours for preparation to submit to WSO.

- Attend all Board of Trustee and Intergroup meetings
- o Distribute monthly newsletter
- o Maintain IG representative list in Gmail
- o Maintain BOT and committee member list in Gmail

- Call for Reports and compiles combined report for IG meetings
- Distributes all reports and meeting agenda to representatives each month
 IG meets
- Act as communicator between IG BOT and group representatives
- Saves all meeting minutes to Dropbox
- o Monitors and addresses inquiries to intergroup email

Annual Duties

- Edits Policy Manual and Bylaw Documents to reflect IG conference decisions
- Submits Bylaw changes to WSO for approval each year after IG conference

 Communicates with web coordinator to post updated procedures and bylaws to local website
